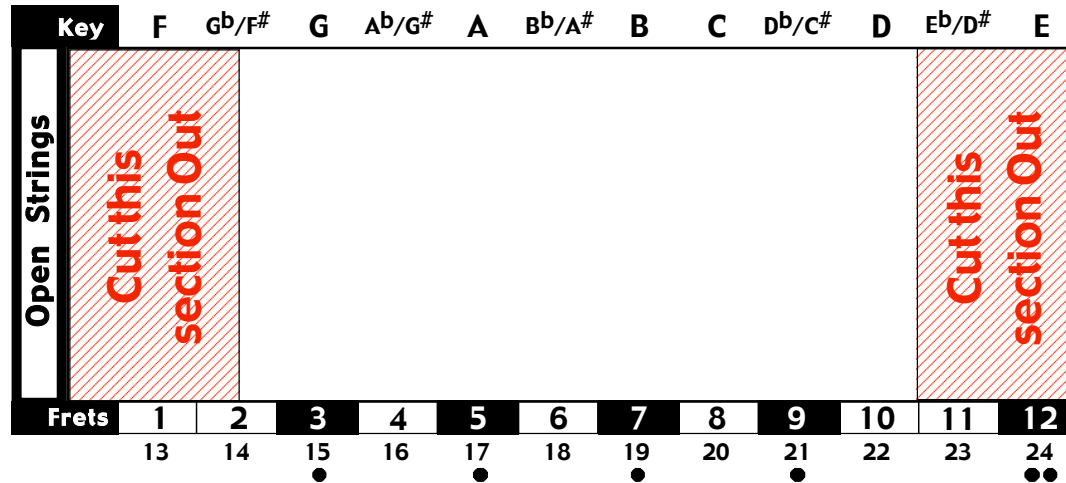

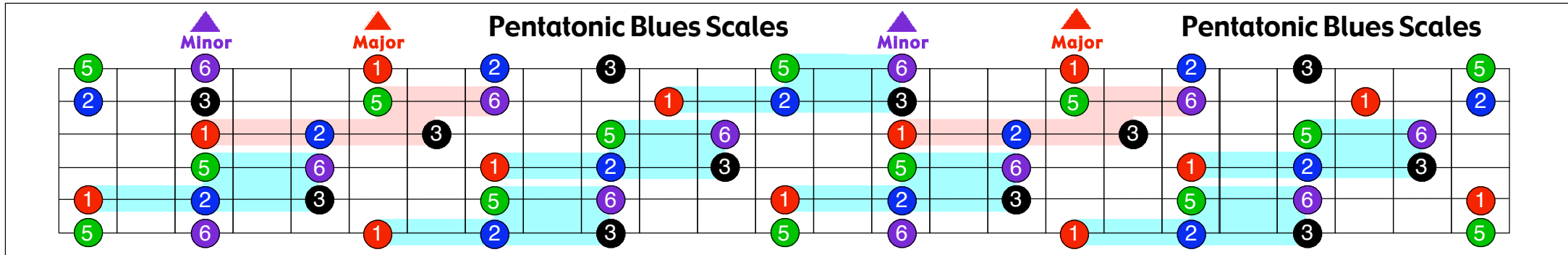

Instructions

1. Cut out both parts of the scale finder.

3. Slide part 2 through part 1 from underneath to find scales
4. Use Scale Blocks (see Explanation on part 1) to play scales more easily.
5. Bend numbered notes (see Explanation on part 1) for extra effect while playing scales.

Easy Songs & Chords for Guitar

The guitar is such a great place to start if you want to learn an instrument. Within a very short space of time you can learn 3-4 chords and be strumming along to some simple songs. And the good news is there are plenty of songs with only 3-4 chords to play.

Learning Chords

The easiest chords to learn are the Major Chords D, A, E. Follow that up with the Minor Chords Em, Am, Dm. Once you are happy with these try C Major and F Major⁷. When you are feeling confident try the more difficult G Major and B⁷ chords.

Basic Strumming

Once you have a few chords in place, they need to be strummed. The simplest way to do that is with your thumb. Run your thumb down the strings from top to bottom.

Easy Songs to Play

The band U2 have many songs that have only a few chords. Don't be put off by chords with sus² or sus⁴ in the name. Dsus² is even simpler than D Major. Find the following at Chordie.com :-

Desire
With or Without You
Pride

Finding Songs on the Internet

To find the chords for other songs, go to your search engine and type in the name of the song followed by "lyrics chords". Sift through your results until you find lyrics and chords that suit you.

You can try the following artists for easy songs.

The Beatles - *Love Me Do, Twist and Shout, Can't Buy Me Love*

Elvis - *All Shook Up, Blue Suede Shoes, Hound Dog*

REM - *Losing My Religion*

Tracy Chapman - *Revolution*

Prince - *Kiss*

Michael Jackson - *Black and White*

Fleetwood Mac - *Dreams*

Simplifying Songs Using a Capo

A Capo is a device that attaches around the neck of your guitar and presses down on the fretboard. It has the effect of shifting the sound up in pitch. This is called transposing. Using a Capo you can take songs with chords that are difficult and change them so they can be played using the simple chords you know. For example Tracy Chapman's song "Fast Car" is played with a Capo on the 2nd fret and with the chords C, G, Em, D. You can see her playing this at Youtube.com - just search for "Tracy Chapman Fast Car".

If you have tricky chords to a song you like, try using TabTransposer.com to shift them to simpler ones. Remember that placing the Capo on the 1st fret has the effect of moving the chords down a semitone. (-1 half step). So a chord like Bb becomes the much easier A.

Summary

There are many great songs to play on the guitar that are easy to learn. Get started and enjoy making music.
